The Legalization of Recreational Marijuana and Workplace Impairment

Recreational Cannabis (marijuana) is now legal in Canada however, it does NOT mean that its use in the workplace is permissible.

Cannabis is a substance that can impair an employee's ability to work effectively and more importantly, safely. Companies and organizations should treat it the same as any other "impairment" causes such as alcohol, illegal drugs, fatigue, stress or illness.
